#### **Health - Sommer Chambers**

As we work to promote breast cancer awareness this month, don't forget to take time for yourself - scheduling your own breast and cervical exam, as well as a mammogram if age and family history recommends one.

For women 40 years and older with average breast cancer risk, getting a mammogram once per year. Women aged 20 to 39 should get a breast exam by a doctor or other healthcare professional every 1 to 3 years.

While we're taking care of up-top, don't forget to consider what's down below! Women aged 21 to 65, should have a Pap test every 3 years if no abnormalities have been found. Women over 65 years of age who have had regular screenings in the previous 10 years may stop cervical cancer screenings as long as they haven't had any serious pre-cancers found in the last 20 years. Just because you can't have children doesn't mean you should stop cervical cancer screenings. When in doubt, ask your doctor.

Buchanan General Hospital offers digital mammography with record-time readings in conjunction with their newest provider, vRad - the most trusted source for radiology interpretations with a 99.7% accuracy rating. If you have any questions, call me for more information!

- Oct. 17 Deadline to register to vote or update your address
- •Nov. 1 Deadline to request absentee ballot by mail

- Nov. 5 Deadline to request absentee ballot in person
- Nov. 8 Election Day (Each vote matters!)

Early voting, through Absentee Ballot, began Sept. 23 at the Buchanan County Registrar's office. Our group is such a community responsive bunch, I sincerely hope we all participate in this critical election. Regardless of your choice, make your citizen voice heard.

A vendor's fee of \$10 will be charged to for-profit businesses; however, Relay for Life teams and non-profit organizations may set up for free.

Additionally, the event will display Bras for a

Relay for Life of Buchanan & Dickenson

Counties. Registration of bras will cost the teams
\$10 each. However, attendees will vote for their
favorite bra with monetary donations. The bra
receiving the most donations will be named the
People's Choice Award Winner. The People's

Choice bra will earn its team all monetary
donations collected that night!

Beginning on October 1st, Surprise Pink Flamingo Flockings will fly into town, spreading awareness and raising donations in their wake!



Here's how it works: In exchange for a monetary donation, an individual may surprise their friends or neighbors with a surprise flocking of pink flamingos, which our women's club members will place in the person's yard. The flamingos will stay in the 'flockee's' yard until they pay to have them 'fly' to another.

The cost: The 'flockor' may purchase a small flocking of 7 flamingos for \$15 or a large flocking of all 42 flamingos for \$100. Potential 'flockees' may purchase insurance to prevent a small flocking for \$25.

Fall officially arrived as of Sept. 23rd. The time that the leaves change from their many shades of green to all the beautiful, shades of red, yellow, orange, pink, magenta and brown. It is a beautiful time for sure, but also a time to think ahead for next spring. The cool temperatures are a wonderful time to work in your own garden to prepare for next spring. Preparations can be made to the ground for your vegetable gardens or if you want to produce some dramatic garden color, now is a great time to plant bulbs such as tulips, daffodils, iris, lilies, giant tulips, and the highly fragranced hyacinths to name a few.
